REFLECTION FOR THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

"They departed for their country by another way." Things were different now. An encounter with the baby Jesus changed the Magi. Before finding the child, they had made a secret alliance with a worldly king, Herod. But after seeing this infant resting in the arms of Mary, their allegiance shifted. Now they became servants of the little Lord Jesus.

They had a kind of conversion through their encounter with Christ, and they knew that they could no longer serve the whims of a wicked ruler. We call this Sunday "Epiphany" because that's what the three wise men had: an epiphany, a moment of realizing the truth about God.

In this moment these three men—kings that they were—"prostrated themselves and did...homage" to the King of Kings. Then they went home by a different route, undoubtedly as different men. Now, their own authority as worldly leaders took on a new character. Now, they were men who served a power greater than themselves.

As it was prophesied in the Old Testament reading from Isaiah, even kings would walk by the "shining radiance" of the Lord. Let us ask ourselves today how the Epiphany of the Lord can redirect *us*. What worldly allegiances have we made that need to be changed? Are we servants of our neighbors' good opinion or of the power of money? Are we secretly aligned with popularity or prestige?

No matter what "rules" our hearts, we are invited to change our direction. We are invited to encounter the little Lord Jesus and offer ourselves to his gentle and loving guidance. After all, his is a kingship of concern for us. As today's psalm says, this King "shall rescue the poor when he cries out, and the afflicted when he has no one to help him."

PASTOR'S CORNER

Five Simple Steps to Discover God's Plans for You BY Rebecca Barlow Jordan

Here are five simple steps that might help. They're not exclusive, and may appear too simple for you. But I believe they work.

ASK: You want wisdom? James 1:5-6 says to ask God for it. But believe God will give it to you. Most of us have a tendency to figure things out on our own. God is saying, "Hello, I'm here. I made you. Trust me."

BE FAITHFUL WHERE YOU ARE. God will not give you greater opportunities or responsibilities if you aren't faithful with what He's already entrusted you in the smaller areas of your life (See Matthew 25:21). Serve Him cheerfully, gratefully, faithfully, wherever you are, no matter what your lot in life may be right now.

LISTEN. Continue to study and pray (and even fast), watching for insights from God's Word and the Holy Spirit. Other trusted believers can help balance your perspective. But in the end, God and His Word never change (Malachi 3.6, James 1.17). God will not "tell" you to do something that is against His righteous character or contrary to the principles in His Word. His Word is powerful, bringing instruction, correction, training, and equipping us thoroughly "for every good work" (2 Timothy 3.16-17). Trying to make decisions without consulting God or His Word is like trying to find our way through a dark tunnel without a flashlight.

WAIT. Waiting is not always easy. Sometimes God gives you more than one good choice. That happened to us one year when two churches were interested in my husband coming to serve as a new staff member. Both churches seemed like possible fits. We considered both, but had no answers. So we waited and prayed. Before we had to make a decision, God had eliminated one and cleared the way for the other.

OBEY. Similar to #2 above, simply keep doing what you know to do, day in and day out. Stay faithful, keep growing, stop worrying, and obey God with the light that He has given you. If your heart's desire is to please and honor the Lord in all you do and in all your decisions, will that decision really be a "bad" one?


